Surfing Spots for Beginners and Beyond. Jacksonville is one of the top surfing destinations on the East Coast. In fact, surfing website *Surfline* named Jacksonville one of the "Best Surf Cities in the World." Summers are ideal for beginners to test out their skills. Jacksonville's beach break has a soft, sandy bottom, which is perfect for beginners. There are plenty of surf schools that offer classes if you're a newbie. After a day on the waves, check out <u>Surfer the Bar</u>, the official *Surfer Magazine* bar and restaurant, located at Jacksonville Beach – the only such location in the continental U.S.

Offshore Scuba Diving. Jacksonville is home to more than 100 artificial reefs packed with corals and sponges as well as exotic marine life, including dozens of colorful species of fish, sharks, sea turtles and more. The area's extensive artificial reef system includes everything from sunken boats to airplanes. Jacksonville's reefs are located along the continental shelf, an underwater landmass in relatively shallow water spanning more than 40 miles wide off the coast. There are many dive operators that offer affordable rates.

Saltwater and Freshwater Fishing. Jacksonville offers exhilarating deep sea fishing, but you don't need a boat to cast your line. Jacksonville's beaches and tidewaters offer convenient fishing access and there are some <u>great fishing spots</u> in the area. The Jacksonville Pier is a popular option, as there is no license required and there are an on-site bait and tackle shop. Anglers can catch everything from whiting, redfish and speckled sea trout to pompano and black drum. In addition, Jacksonville's lakes, rivers, and creeks are flush with species including speckled perch, catfish and largemouth bass, to name a few.
