With its new offices and staff, DCIM expands to meet unprecedented demand for its approach to wellbeing and chronic illness

Practitioners at DCIM use the initial 90-minute appointment, for example, to understand the patient's entire medical history, as well as her family's. DCIM offers advanced diagnostic testing to uncover persistent-but-often-overlooked conditions. The doctors at DCIM delve into environmental and lifestyle issues and develope individually tailored detailed health plans. The resulting "deep dive" is a highly personalized analysis of the patient's health.

In addition to their traditional, western medical training, the doctors at DCIM are also trained in Integrative and Functional Medicine. These disciplines treat the whole person rather than a specific disease. Because of their holistic approach, these disciplines prioritize the physician-patient relationship.



Dr. Dsouza's personalized approach has proven particularly effective at treating chronic diseases that have not responded well to traditional managed care. For example, many patients come to DCIM to address autoimmune diseases like Hashimoto's <u>Hypothyroidism</u>, Rheumatoid Arthritis, Vitiligo, Multiple Sclerosis, Lupus, Psoriasis, Celiac disease, and Sjoren's Syndrome. The Center also specializes in women's health issues, including Alopecia (hair loss), <u>Menopause and Perimenopause</u>, and <u>Polycystic</u> <u>Ovarian Syndrome</u> (PCOS), as well as professional women juggling modern demands and looking to achieve their optimal health state.

Patients, especially those looking for an integrative medicine doctor in Washington DC, have responded with the overwhelming demand for Dr. Dsouza's approach. To meet the demand, DCIM moved into bigger offices and expanded its staff. With its new offices and expanded staff, DCIM is now well-positioned to meet that extraordinary demand.


