Under the care of a popular Hollywood makeup artist, her lipstick is removed and replaced by a full beard and trucker hat to transform into "one of the guys." The movie shows she immediately tripled her winnings in online tournaments and casino play, and so she decided to enter the WSOP competition like a *man*. Unfortunately for Sia, when the **World Series of Poker** found out about her plan, they vowed to disqualify her and keep her \$10,000 tournament buy-in if she played in their game dressed as a man.

Overall, *Poker Queens* honors the bright, talented and gutsy female professionals who live and breathe poker. We see what they were like as kids, how they think, and what makes them winners.

"We were blessed to get the participation of the most skilled women in poker," producer Christine D. Beatty says. "Jennifer Tilly, Kristen Bicknell, Liv Boeree, Jennifer Harman, Gillian Epp, Loni Harwood, Kathy Liebert, Esther Taylor, Kelly Minken ... the list is long." The film's cast of poker pros also includes male players Ryan Depaulo, **Daniel** "**Kid Poker**" **Negreanu**, Steve Blay, Joey Ingram, Jeff Boski and mind coach Elliot Roe—all of whom support bringing more women to the poker table.
