
## Chloe Reading is closing the gap on inclusion with Radio Equal

Radio Equal launches Radio Equal Network, Disability Inclusive Satellite Radio with Global Coverage





Miss Reading said "When I was an 11-year-old kid with no friends and very little social skills Pete took me under his wing and taught me everything I know about broadcasting, the education and wealth of knowledge I received from Pete is more than any university could have taught me.

When Miss Reading was asked why Radio Equal she said "I've lived a very sheltered life and hidden my disability from the eyes of the public, as a 30-year old I found I had come to a point in my life where I've learnt to be comfortable in my own skin. I no longer hide my disability from the world, I have Spina Bifida, This is me.
