Other RN job functions include leadership, research, performing diagnostic tests and analyzing results, operating medical equipment, administering medications, recording patients' symptoms and medical histories, and assisting with patient rehabilitation and follow-up.

A Certified Pediatric Nurse (CPN) is a nurse who works in the offices of family physicians and pediatricians, as well as in hospitals and clinics. Much of their work revolves around gaining children's trust and helping put them at ease, so doctors can examine and treat them. The nurse can also take the patients' vital signs, conduct examinations, and take samples for laboratory testing. In addition, pediatric nurses play an important role in prevention and wellness by coaching kids and their parents in proper lifestyle and hygiene habits. Some pediatric nurses also work in public health, providing care through school systems or community clinics.
