She went home on leave for two weeks and was home for three days when she got orders and was reassigned to the 249th Surgical Hospital. She had to clear her post at Fort Ord and was sent to Fort Carson in Colorado to prepare for her new assignment with the 249th Surgical Hospital in Asaka, Japan. She was honorably discharged in 1967, after which she and her husband moved to Amarillo, where she began working at Baptist Saint Anthony's Hospital. In 1992, she earned her Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) degree from West Texas A&M University.

Having dedicated over 50 years of service to the nursing profession, Mary attributes her success to her love of helping others, her education, the challenges of the field, as well as always learning, being a leader, and making a difference.
