The music video is also available in Manie Singh's official <u>YouTube Channel</u>, ManieOfficial, where it has claimed more than 100,000 views within a month. He also runs an Instagram page, manieofficial, which he updates regularly.

Although *Farmaan* certainly deserves attention, this is not his first big project. He already has an album to his name – *Outburst*. Created with sophisticated lyrics, catchy beats, and pleasant music influenced by his Hindi and Punjabi heritage, *Outburst* features many popular songs such as <u>Aankhon Se</u> (2014) released on T-Series, *Crazy* (2014) released on T-Series, *Tang Lang Lang* (2015) released on Saga Hits, and *Oh Celina* (2017) released on Zee Music.

What makes Manie's music stand out from the others'? According to him, it is his imagination and technical skills. His songs are full of liveliness and energy, but, at the same time, bound with an element of Sufi music that makes them sound "soothing" to his fans.
