A Critical Care Registered Nurse (CCRN) has received specialized training that enables him or her to manage and monitor those patients who are the most seriously ill or injured. They can work in several different environments, including intensive care units (adult, pediatric, neonatal, neurological, burn, etc.), emergency rooms, operating/recovery rooms, trauma units, surgery centers, and flight nursing.
