The ABPN is a not-for-profit corporation dedicated to promoting high-quality patient care for the public through the initial and continuing certification of psychiatrists and neurologists.

In good standing with a number of professional organizations, Dr. Shapiro is a member of the Medical Society of the State of New York, the New York Council on Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, the New York County Psychiatric Society, and the New York County Medical Society. She is also a Founding Board Member of the AACAP's Political Action Committee and on the Board of Directors of the American Psychiatric Association (APA) Foundation.

She won the Hulse Award in 2017 from the New York Council of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, and the Bruno Lima Award for her role as a leader in the disaster relief efforts in San Diego from the American Psychiatric Association. She also served as the Editor of the Child Development Chapter of the 2017 Edition of Kaplan and Sadock's "Comprehensive Textbook of Psychiatry"
