Woods joined BOMA Edmonton in 1997. Under Woods, BOMA Edmonton flourished, increasing its membership fivefold. Today, BOMA Edmonton members represent more than 70% of Edmonton companies that own or manage the office, retail, industrial, or investment properties.

Woods was also active outside of Edmonton and has become synonymous with the BOMA brand throughout Canada. He helped to found BOMA Canada and became the first chair of all BOMA executives from coast to coast. Other local legacies attributed to Woods include the successful annual BOMA Edmonton Leasing Guide and annual awards of excellence and top-rated professional development education to thousands of commercial real estate professionals.

Baroldi is also co-founder of the national intercity exchange, Designing Downtown, which she conceived of while marketing commercial real estate in Western Canada. In 2015, she was selected for the prestigious Governor General's Canadian Leadership Conference. In 2012/13, she was named one of Edmonton's Top 40 under 40, Top 100 Women in Business, and Alberta Venture Magazine's Ten Rising Stars.
