

The model has also taken part in many fashion shows including Atlanta fashion week, New York fashion week, Seattle fashion week, South Korea fashion show, Miss Washington pageant, Miss Bellevue pageant, Beverly Hills fashion show and many more. As well as modelling Ibaadat has many talents, she likes writing poetry, dancing, and singing. She said: "I am currently working on my song that I am dedicating to my mother."

Ibaadat talks about her childhood life, she said: "My teenage years were a colourless palette of darkness. I did not realize it back then I was going through depression and I had no way to express my feelings to anyone. I was taken care of 8 people in my household at the same time as I was attending school. I did not want to be a disappointment, so I had to set an example for them. She decided to become a model to give meaning to what a model is. She said: "A model is not just someone who puts on makeup or someone who shows skin. As an Afghan model, I wanted to make sure I can inspire girls who are at home thinking my dream is impossible to achieve if I can be Afghan model they can be whatever they dream of being, anything is possible. I want to show the true beauty of my country and my love for Afghanistan. I faced many struggles to make my modelling dream come true. The hardest part was to make sure I get my education and at the same time working to provide for my family. It was not easy, but the struggle was worth

In 2014 Bahari Ibaadat was crowned Miss Afghanistan in Dubai. She said: "We had over 88 girls around the world there and there were 9 of us from America. When I won Miss Afghanistan in 2014 it was the best moment of my life. I was a tomboy during my childhood, and I was never told I was beautiful. So, once I won Miss Afghanistan, I could not believe it, it was the proudest moment of my life to be able to represent my country. I was lost for words as I was named the most beautiful girl in my country." Moreover, Ibaadat said: "The Afghan community's reaction toward my work was not so positive. I believe in our community there is more love and respect for singers than a model. I faced lots of hate more than love at the beginning. When my work started growing, they started to see that I am not just a model for looks I am trying to pass on positive messages to young girls who want to become model. My message for Afghan women who wants to become model is I know it's not easy I know you are scared of what others will think but don't give up and go after your dreams you can make a difference.
