Your vehicle won't start for a number of causes, although some of them are more common than others. Here are five usual reasons why your car won't start, as well as some tips to keep your automobile in good form!

Your car battery is dead

The most common reason for your car not gearing up is a dead battery. A car's battery provides electrical backup to the whole vehicle and its electrical parts (e.g., lights, radio, etc.). You won't start the automobile or utilize any electrical components if the battery isn't fully charged.

Many factors can make your battery die:

- Your headlights were left on overnight or for an extended period.
- You've got a cable that is snagged.
- The component is water vaporized, which results in low conductivity power.
- The battery's life has reached its end.

The most common symptoms are:

- None of the electrical components function correctly (e.g., the lights, radio, and others.).
- The battery light is turned on carelessly.

Jumpstart your automobile to know if the issue is with the battery. If this process works, you're probably dealing with a dead battery or an alternator having difficulties charging the battery. Replace the battery, or you can say alternator, clean the connections, or get a professional to handle the work for you.

Inflammation caused by a faulty ignition switch

If your battery appears to be in stable condition, but your car won't start after a few tries, your ignition switch is creating an issue probably. Turn on your headlights to narrow down the source of the problem because your car's battery is the controller of the headlights and dashboard, and if they turn on but your engine won't start, a faulty ignition switch is most likely to blame.

A faulty ignition system

Another usual reason for your car not starting is a starter that is broken. A starter's job is to make the engine start (pistons, crankshaft, etc.) when the ignition switch is turned active or working. The starter's job is done once the engine is started and moving. When the starter shows failure, the engine will not crank properly or when the ignition key is turned on. A broken or weaker starter could cause your automobile not to start if you listen to a clicking sound the moment you attempt to start it.

Fuel filter that is blocked

The gasoline will not be able to extend up to the engine if the filter of your fuel is blocked. This makes it challenging for your vehicle to get working by burning the fuel it requires. Fuel filters should be changed every 15,000 to 20,000 kilometers. Therefore ask your mechanic about it the next time you take your car for servicing.

A gas tank that is completely depleted

You may think this is silly if this is the cause of your car not starting, but it occurs more often than you think! When you're continuously traveling about, it's easy to forget that your gas tank has to be updated.

The answer is easy... grab some more gas!

You should never have to deal with a situation where your car won't start.
