Horsetail is a "living fossil", the only living genus of the entire subclass Equisetidae, which for over 100 million years dominated the earth. Chemical analysis revealed that silica is accumulated in horsetail in amounts of up to 25% (Timell 1964;

Lewin and Reimann 1969).

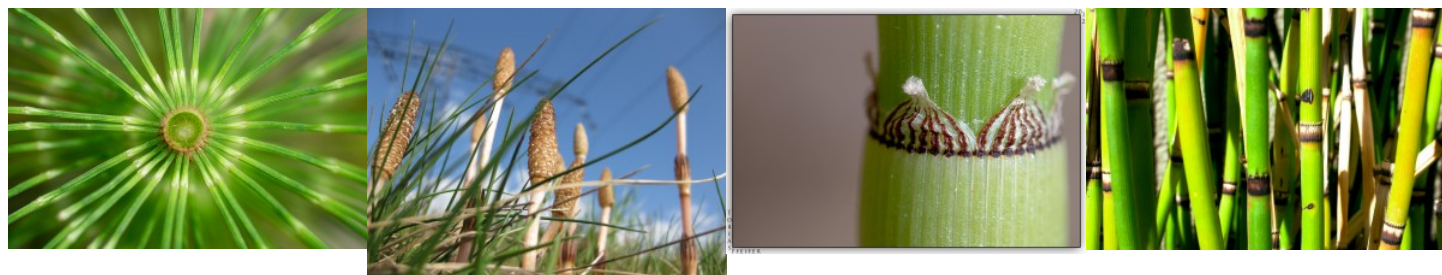
