"In our fast-moving lives where the importance of creative tradition is so easily forgotten, we trust in the simple pleasure of putting pen to paper," Bekdache said. "That is why we devoted most of our time to perfecting our paper's performance, while all the while ensuring the highest standards of sustainability."

Bekdache was honored by Forbes at a celebration and networking event for the 30 Under 30 Middle East in Egypt at the end of last year.
