and fathers are mistaken as the brother of the groom.

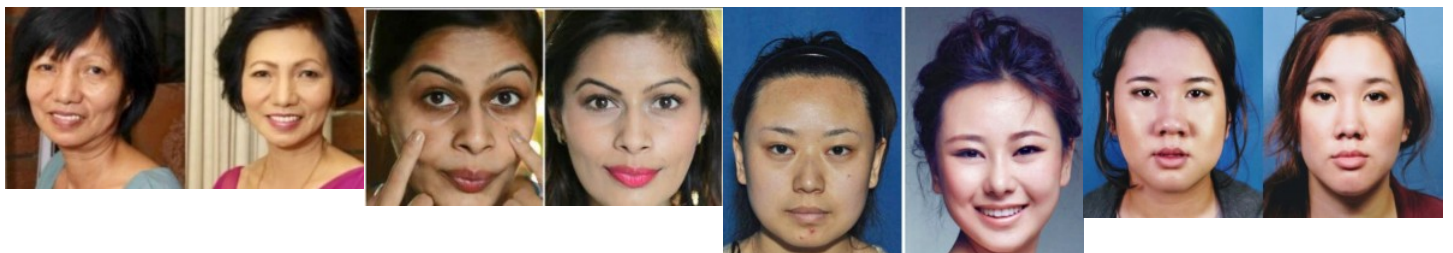
