The JACK-FORK boasts a user-friendly design that is easy to use, making it an ideal choice for drive-thru restaurant owners. Furthermore, the JACK-FORK

can be produced in various design variations, including a biodegradable aspen tree version, manufactured by a New Mexico-based company that exports disposable chopsticks to Japan. Aspen wood, derived from aspen trees, is the primary material used to make disposable chopsticks, with approximately 20 billion pairs being used annually, mostly in Japan.

Davis's creation is the latest evolution in a long line of utensil innovations. The spork, an amalgamation of a spoon and fork, has undergone continuous improvements since its earliest ancestor was created by Dr. Samuel W. Francis in 1874. Over the years, the spork gained popularity, with Hyde W. Ballard even trademarking the term "spork" in 1951. Fast-food giants like Kentucky Fried Chicken (KFC) were quick to adopt the spork, and it has since become a common utensil found in establishments such as Taco Bell and other fast-food restaurants.
