Additionally, he is an active member of the American Academy of Physician Assistants, the Association of Physician Assistants in Oncology, the Permian Basin Physician Assistant Society, and graduated as a member of the Pi Alpha National Honor Society for Physician Assistants.

A Certified Physician Assistant (PA-C) is a healthcare practitioner who practices medicine in collaboration with physicians. They examine patients, prescribe medicine, and order diagnostic tests. In most cases, they work under the supervision of physicians or surgeons, but they can work more independently in some states, rural areas, and inner-city areas, consulting with physicians only when they need help with cases.

Affiliated with Rays of Hope Children's Grief Center of Midland, Ryan works with children ranging from kindergartners to sixth graders currently going through a "change" in their lives that can be either a divorce, deployment, incarceration, or death of a loved one.
