
OUTLIERS: A Medical Thriller Unveiling a Sinister Healthcare Conspiracy

Before his health setback, Dr. Lundy dedicated himself to full-time internal medicine practice at the Dartmouth-Hitchcock Clinic in Manchester and Bedford, New Hampshire. Within the clinic, he held the esteemed position of Department Chair for the Adult Primary Care Department and served as a Clinical Assistant Professor in the Department of Medicine at the Geisel School of Medicine at Dartmouth. He then served on staff at Mount Auburn Hospital for an additional two years, concurrently holding the role of Instructor of Medicine at Harvard Medical School. In 1997, Dr. Lundy transitioned to New Hampshire, where he practiced in a private group setting until January 2008, when he joined the Dartmouth-Hitchcock Clinic.

Currently, Dr. Lundy resides in Cape Coral, Florida, alongside Thomas Ouellette and their two beloved Pugs, Saffron (Saffy) and Piper.
