He highlights how native plants, smart irrigation systems, and green infrastructure can reduce environmental impact while enhancing outdoor spaces. His experience as Principal Designer for Coastal Elements Landscaping and Project Manager for GreenScape Urban Solutions has allowed him to implement these principles in real-world projects.

One key area of focus is water conservation and stormwater management, particularly in South Florida's unique climate. Feinsilver's projects often incorporate rain gardens, bioswales, and permeable surfaces to control runoff and maximize efficiency.

"Water is one of our most valuable resources, but we treat it like an afterthought," he explains. "A well-designed landscape manages water efficiently instead of letting it go to waste."

Designing for People and Community

Feinsilver believes that outdoor spaces should be inviting and accessible. Whether designing urban parks or private gardens, his goal is to create areas that encourage human connection and environmental awareness.

One of his favorite projects involved revitalizing an underused city park by integrating multi-use areas, improved drainage, and native planting. The result was a community hub that transformed how people interacted with the space.

"A public space should feel welcoming," he says. "If people don't want to spend time there, then it's not doing its job."

Looking Ahead

Feinsilver sees landscape architecture as a crucial tool in addressing climate change, urbanization, and environmental degradation. He advocates for cities to incorporate green infrastructure and climate-resilient landscapes into urban planning, ensuring that public spaces remain functional and sustainable for future generations.

"I want to see more cities integrating nature into their planning," he states. "Green infrastructure isn't just a luxury—it's a necessity for the future."

Feinsilver's work continues to focus on projects that align with his core values: sustainability, resilience, and connection to nature.
