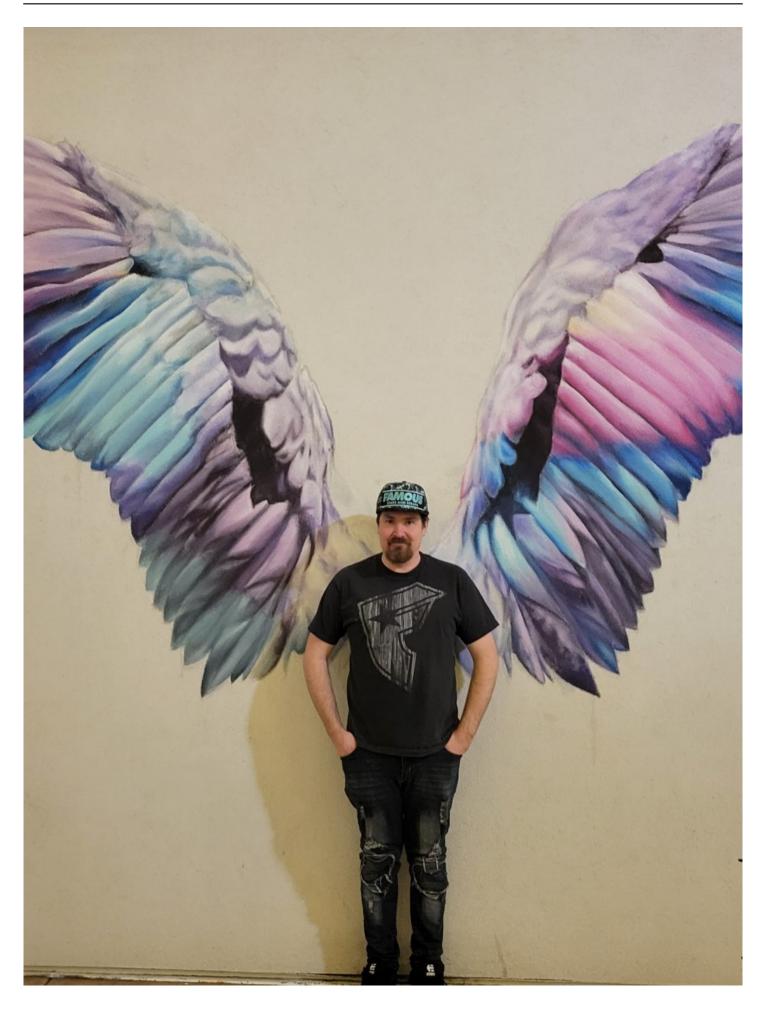
Nathan Olsen Embraces a New Purpose: Living to Help Others Without Fear or Financial Worry
