This shift unearthed countless hidden collections as people cleaned out their attics and basements while stuck at home. "COVID was a mixed bag, but it also led to a boom in vinyl resurfacing," he adds.

# Vinyl as a Generational Bridge

One of the most striking trends over the past five years has been the rise of intergenerational vinyl collecting. "We've seen a huge increase in father-daughter and mother-son pairs coming into the store together," says Noble. "It's clear that the pandemic helped create entire vinyl-collecting families, and that the love of records is something that bridges generations through classic sounds."

# What's Hot in Chicago's Vinyl Scene?

The Chicago vinyl market has remained largely stable, but certain trends have emerged. "Classic Rock is very much back," says Noble. "It wasn't in high demand five years ago, but it's now a staple again." Meanwhile, rare psychedelic rock, jazz, and R&B - especially <u>rare R&B 45s</u> - remain strongholds of the collector's market.

Newer genres are also making waves. "<u>Underground '80s</u> and <u>'90s alternative</u> and hip-hop are rising in demand almost daily," he notes. "We're also seeing younger buyers who first got into records through modern artists like Juice WRLD or new emo releases—some of them will stick with vinyl and eventually start exploring older music as well."

### **Looking Ahead: The Next Five Years**

As We Buy Records enters its next chapter, it aims to keep expanding and diversifying its offerings. "We're not just about vinyl anymore—we're getting into vintage stereo gear, and we think CDs and tapes are about to have a resurgence," says Noble. "They're low-value now, but demand is growing."

With its commitment to preserving music history, serving collectors, and adapting to shifting trends, We Buy Records Chicago is poised to remain a cornerstone of the city's music scene for years to come.


